Clinical research nursing is defined as clinical nursing practice with a specialty focus on research implementation and the care of subjects participating in clinical research. In addition to providing and coordinating clinical care, clinical research nurses have a central role in ensuring participant safety, ongoing maintenance of informed consent, integrity of protocol implementation, accuracy of data collection, and data recording, and follow-up.
